

Lukas Heckendorn Urscheler is Vice-Director of the Swiss Institute of Comparative Law, where he is heading the Legal Division. He has graduated from the University of Fribourg, Switzerland, with a bilingual degree (French/German) and a specialization in European Law in 1999. Following his degree (lic.iur.), he has worked as research assistant at the University of Fribourg (Prof. F. Werro) and done extensive research on European Private Law in Sweden (Stockholm University) and Germany (Max Planck Institute on Foreign and International Private Law). His doctoral thesis on Professional Liability in Europe (University of Fribourg, summa cum laude) was published in 2006. Prior to joining the SICL in 2009, he was Assistant Professor of conflicts of law, contract and tort Law at Kathmandu School of Law (2006-2008) in Nepal, where he carried out research on Comparative Tort and Criminal Law (LLM, KSL). For the purpose of the same research, he obtained a Post Graduate Certificate in International Criminal Justice from London University. He has also worked at several public and private law offices in Switzerland, as well as at the United Nations (observer for the United Nations Mission to Ethiopia and Eritrea, 2004-2005). He has published on tort and succession law as well as on comparative law.
