Michael Stürner is Professor of Civil Law, Private International Law and Comparative Law at Europa-Universität Viadrina Frankfurt (Oder), Germany since 2009. He is coeditor of the *European Community Private Law Review* (GPR), co-editor of the *Yearbook of Italian Law* (JbItalR), and Assistant Editor of the *International Journal of Procedural Law*. A former Feodor-Lynen Scholar at Florence University, Italy, he has mainly published in the field of cross-border civil litigation, comparative law, conflicts of law, and European private law. He has previously been working in the litigation department of a major international law firm in Cologne, Germany.

His past research projects include a commentary on the European Enforcement Order for uncontested claims (Nomos, 2010), various publications on the role of State immunity within the framework of the Brussels I regulation, and a book on "The Principle of Proportionality in European Contract Law" (Mohr Siebeck, 2010) which has been financially supported by the German Research Foundation (DFG).

His current research projects include a study on the impact of European law on the interpretation of public policy clauses, a study on the European Small Claims Procedure as well as a book on European Contract Law (as a co-author).
