

Peter D. Trooboff is Senior Counsel in the Washington office of Covington & Burling LLP and specializes in public and private international legal matters. His practice concentrates particularly on U.S. export and foreign trade controls, international trade law issues, investment disputes and international litigation and arbitral matters. Mr. Trooboff graduated from Columbia College (A.B., 1964, cum laude), Harvard University (LL.B., 1967, cum laude) and the London School of Economics (LL.M., 1968). Mr. Trooboff is a former president of the American Society of International Law (1990-92), an honorary member of the Board of Editors of the *American Journal of International Law* and currently serves as the Society's delegate to the American Council of Learned Societies and is currently serving a four-year term on the Council's Executive Committee of Delegates. In 1968 he was awarded the diploma in private international law (cum laude) by the Hague Academy of International Law on whose Curatorium (board) he has served as the United States member since 1991. Mr. Trooboff delivered the Academy's general course in private international law in the summer of 2008. He served for many years on the U.S. delegation to the Hague Conference on Private International Law in connection with successful completion in 2005 of the Conference's Convention on Choice of Court Agreements. The American Bar Association Section of International Law presented to Mr. Trooboff in April 2010 the Leonard J. Theberge Award for Private International Law.
