## **CCBE** background

- Members are bars and law societies





#### **CCBE** and e-Justice

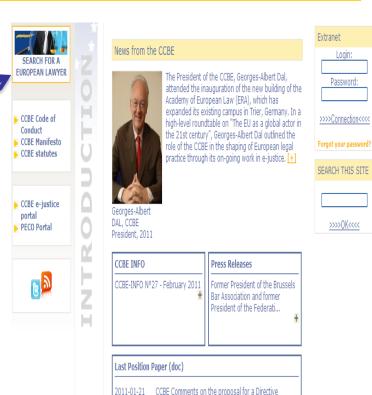
- CCBE fully supports the developments in e-Justice in two ways:
  - a). Policy: CCBE contributes to EC consultations as well as prepares position papers on e-Justice topics
  - b). Active participation in e-Justice projects: Find-A-Lawyer, e-CODEX, FAL 2, Defendants' rights fact-sheets



## Find-A-Lawyer background

 There is an existing search engine ('Search for a European lawyer') on our website – www.ccbe.eu

 We have a grant to develop a system with common search criteria to be located on the European e-Justice web portal and available in all official languages



of the European Parliament and of the Council on the right to information in criminal

proceedings



### Participation in FAL

#### Main actors in Find-A-Lawyer:

- 1. <u>CCBE</u>: Responsible for developing the project, management and relations with the European Commission, the IT sub-contractor and the participating Bars.
- 2. <u>Bars</u>: 13 national bars are participating in FAL. The CCBE hopes all EU Bars will join Find-A-Lawyer in the future. Negotiations with some Bars are taking place at this moment.
- 3. <u>IT contractor</u>: a Danish IT company with good experience in developing IT solutions for lawyers (InterConnect) has been subcontracted.



# FAL vs other engines

- There are currently other FALs available
- Differences between FAL SE and other engines:

FAL SE	Others		
Comprehensive list of lawyers accredited and maintained by competent authorities (Bars)	People self-register and so the lists are not comprehensive		
Developed by CCBE with national Bars, which have a public duty to maintain such a register (non-profit making)	Developed by private companies		
Bars ensure changes in lawyer status (changes of personal or professional data, areas of expertise, whether still a lawyer etc.)	The lawyer has to update personally his/her profile		
Lawyers are included in the directory on qualifying as a lawyer	The lawyer needs to know that these other search engines exist		
Multilingual	Normally in one language		
Developed taking into account the EC's preferences, and with the citizen in mind	Normally developed with the needs of companies in mind

#### e-CODEX

- The CCBE is one of the partners in this project, and considers e-CODEX to be of crucial importance for the legal profession.
- Why is the CCBE participating in this project?
  - ✓ Lawyers will be among the main users of e-Justice applications
  - ✓ In some Member States, lawyers are already using national e-justice tools in their daily work: e.g. Austria, Spain



#### Role of lawyers within e-CODEX

- Participation of lawyers is regulated by lawyers' directives:
  Temporary services (77/249/EEC) and Establishment (98/5/EC)
- Moreover:
  - ✓ In some Member States, lawyers have to prove their lawyer's qualification on filing (<u>lawyer's identity</u>)
  - ✓ Members States can also request from the lawyer the <u>mandate</u> of the client to act on his/her behalf
  - ✓ Since the proof of lawyer's identity and client mandate are compulsory in some Member States, e-CODEX has to deal with both issues - the "electronic" world has to follow the rules of the "paper" world



# Find-A-Lawyer 2

- CCBE is working on a proposal to develop FAL 2, which will be submitted to the EC for funding within the Criminal Justice Programme.
- Main objectives:
  - ✓ To guarantee and enhance the citizens' right to access to justice.
  - ✓ To create an IT prototype that, using the FAL Search Engine, will make it possible to verify lawyers' e-identity
  - ✓ To create more services that could be added to the existing FAL.
